# Fox Chapel Area Schools Sports Hall of Fame

# **Fall Sports Update**

This fall Fox Chapel Athletes again excelled on the field and in the classroom. All 10 varsity teams finished the fall with section records of .500 or better. 8 teams qualified for WPIAL playoffs, 5 captured section championships, 2 finished 3rd in WPIAL, 2 finished 2nd in WPIAL and 1 WPIAL team championship. One WPIAL individual title and one PIAA individual title were included in the fall championship haul.

Here are the highlights...

- Field Hockey Undefeated Section Champs; WPIAL Champions after defeating Pine Richland in the WPIAL finals. This is the girls third WPIAL title in the last four years. Lost in the 1st round of PIAAs.
- Cross Country Girls finished second in the WPIAL Championships to earn the first PIAA berth in program history. Sophomores Annika Urban and Sareena Seager placed in the top 10 at the WPIAL followed by a top 20 finish for Sareena at the PIAA finals. Senior Adam Cook and freshman Christian Fitch both qualified for the PIAA meet from the boys team.
- Boys Golf Section Champs; WPIAL Team Runner-up; Sophomore Gregor Meyer was the WPIAL Individual Chamption. Alex Lawson, Anthony Cordaro, and, Grant Thiele qualified for WPIAL finals, Meyer, Lawson, and Cordaro qualified for PIAA semi-finals; Lawson and Cordaro finished tied 6th at the PIAA Championships.
- Girls Soccer Team finished as Section Champions; WPIAL semifinalists, 3rd in WPIAL. The 3rd place WPIAL finish earned the team a berth in the PIAA playoffs.
- **Girls Tennis** Section Champions; 3rd place in WPIAL tournament; PIAA quarterfinalist; Amanda Nord (junior) and Charlotte James (freshman) teamed up to capture the WPIAL and PIAA doubles titles. This is the programs 3rd PIAA title in the past four years.
- **Girls Volleyball** WPIAL playoffs after finishing the section season 6-6.
- **Boys Soccer** WPIAL playoffs where they lost to eventual WPIAL champion in overtime.
- Girls Golf Qualified four players for the WPIAL Championship: seniors Ursula Meyer and Kerstin Nestel & juniors Hannah Conroy and Cara Levicoff
- Football Finished the season with a section record of 4-4, overall 5-5 after starting with four losses. 10 players received all-conference honors.

#### **NOMINATIONS NEEDED**

Each January, the Hall of Fame considers and selects inductees to honor at the spring banquet. Athletes, who are ten years removed from Fox Chapel, are selected based on their contributions to athletics at Fox Chapel and beyond.

The Hall of Fame Committee is surprised each year by the number of outstanding candidates that have never been nominated for consideration.

# FUHRER FAMILY, RICH KRISTON AND ED BOYLE SCHOLARSHIPS

Beginning in January, applications for the three scholarships awarded at the June Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be available in the high school guidance department.

- Fuhrer Family Scholarship is awarded to a Fox Chapel Area athlete who has demonstrated athletic and academic achievement along with financial need. The athlete chosen will be awarded 2,500 dollars a year, renewable for four years based on academic merit. Applicants need not plan on participating in college athletics to be eligible.
- Rich Kriston Scholarship was established to honor a Fox Chapel Area High School senior who has excelled in athletic activity while maintaining high sportsmanship standards. The scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000 for a Fox Chapel Area High School Senior who has shown a commitment to continuing his/her education beyond high school.
- Ed Boyle Scholarship is named for the beloved physical education teacher and coach who initiated the Fox Chapel Area SchoolDistrict soccer program. This is a one-time award for a Fox Chapel Area soccer player who has exemplified the spirit and talents of Coach Boyle.
